Janice is worried that her family and boyfriend will get tired of helping her and leave her all alone.</p> <p>Janice is worried that she could accidentally overdose and die.</p> <p>Marcia is worried that Janice will not be able to quit using drugs.</p> <p>Marcia is worried that Janice will not be able to be involved in Jaree's life.</p> <p>Marcia is worried that Janice will die from drug use.</p> <p>Jaree was left home alone by Janice, putting Jaree at risk of harm.</p> <p>Jaree left the apartment to search for her mother and was found wandering alone, outside, late at night.</p> <p>Jaree's needs were not met by Janice when Janice was using.</p> <p>Jaree could be harmed or become ill if she comes into contact with either drugs or drug paraphernalia.</p>	<p>Jaree is happy and likes living with her aunt Marcia and cousin Leila.</p> <p>Janice and Jaree have a good relationship.</p> <p>During family time, Jaree and Janice talk, play, and show affection toward each other.</p> <p>Janice loves and cares about Jaree and says she want to have Jaree home.</p> <p>Janice says Jaree is a good girl and hardly ever gets in trouble.</p> <p>Janice has shown that she knows age appropriate discipline to use with Jaree.</p> <p>Janice has a history of sober parenting and meeting Jaree's needs.</p> <p>Janice is working now.</p> <p>Janice has had steady employment over time.</p> <p>Janice is looking for another job. Janice is going to AA meetings again. Janice has maintained stable housing. Janice has working transportation.</p> <p>Janice has hopes of being able to go back to school in computer networking.</p> <p>Janice has a good support from Marcia and Lisa and David.</p> <p>Marcia is committed to Jaree and Janice and says she will do whatever it takes, for as long as it takes.</p> <p>Marcia is open to family time and family time coaching.</p>	<p>Janice she needs to keep going to meetings.</p> <p>Janice needs to start back with regular meeting with the rehab counselor.</p> <p>Janice needs to not get high before family time with Jaree.</p> <p>Janice will call to reschedule family time if she is high when she is scheduled for family time with Jaree.</p> <p>Janice will call at least 4 hours in advance if she needs to reschedule family time.</p> <p>Janice will talk with Mack about not staying over if he has been using meth. <p><b>Harm and Safety Threats</b></p> <p>Jaree was left home alone by Janice, Jaree left the apartment to search for her mother and was found wandering alone, outside, late at night, dirty and hungry.</p>	<p><b>Genogram, Ecomap, Circles of Safety and Support</b></p> <p>Jaree and Janice have strong support in Marcia, Leila,</p> <p><b>Cultural Considerations</b></p> <p>Jaree is white and African American. Lives with her white aunt and cousin and her family supports are predominantly white.</p> <p><b>SDM® System Guidance</b></p> <p>HAS completed during the investigation. Results: in Jaree was considered unsafe, placed with a relative, unable to return home at this time. Risk considered high at time of investigation.</p>	<p><b>Safety and Permanency/Belonging</b></p> <p>Past safety: Jaree was well cared for by Janice, her needs were met and her mother did not leave her unsupervised with the help of her family.</p> <p>Janice has maintained family ties and ensured Jaree has connections to her family. Janice and Jaree talk, laugh, show physical affection, play, and enjoy each other's company during family time.</p>
<p><b>Complicating Factors</b></p> <p>Janice's hours at work have recently been cut back, causing concerns that she may lose her job. This creates stress about bills, housing, etc.</p> <p>Janice's boyfriend stays over frequently.</p>	<p><b>Gray Areas</b></p> <p>Janice was active in a church for a number of years; is the church a source of support?</p> <p>Are there paternal relatives that could be part of the family's network?</p>	<p><b>Strengths and Resources</b></p> <p>Janice is going to AA meetings again. Janice has strong relationship with sister (relative placement). Family doctor had no concerns about Jaree prior to this incident.</p> <p>Janice has had steady employment over time. Janice has maintained stable housing. Janice has reliable transportation. Janice has shown that she knows age appropriate discipline.</p>
What needs to happen?		

<p><b>Worry Statements</b></p> <p>Jaree's needs were not met by Janice when Janice was using (for example, Jaree was not feed, bathed, supervised).</p> <p>Jaree may be physically harmed or become ill if she comes into contact with either drugs or drug paraphernalia.</p> <p>Jaree may be traumatized when she and her mother are separated and living apart.</p>	<p><b>Goal Statements</b></p> <p>Jaree will be cared for by a safe and sober adult at all times who meets her needs.</p>
<p><b>Action Steps</b></p> <p>SAFETY Scale: Janice is a 6; Jaree is a 5; Marcia is a 4; and DCFS is a 3.</p> <p>Janice agrees to commit to attending one AA meeting per week.</p> <p>Marcia has agreed to supervised family time within the Dunn home, with DCFS initially present for coaching, with a plan to reduce the presence of the DCFS staff person.</p> <p>Janice has agreed that she will not get high before family time with Jaree.</p> <p>Janice will call the DCFS worker at least 4 hours in advance to reschedule family time if she is high and cannot engage with Jaree for family time.</p> <p>DCFS will work with Janice and Marcia to schedule family time in Marcia's home and/or other settings, such as a shopping trip.</p> <p>DCFS will continue to explore potential family for a paternal network.</p>
