	family in self-assessment; educating the family regarding adoption and foster care, and
	documenting information in a written report.
201-3	The worker understands the value of pre-service and ongoing in-service training for foster
	and adoptive families.
201-4	The worker can assess the needs of children requiring foster or adoptive placement and
	can select the most appropriate, least restrictive, most homelike, culturally relevant
	placement setting to meet the child s developmental and treatment needs.
201-5	The worker is able to develop collaborative relationships with foster and adoptive families
	and can promote joint planning and delivery of services for children in care.
201-6	The worker understands court procedure and the decision-making process, can compile
	and document information to support a court filing or permanent custody action, and can
	collaborate with the legal representative to implement a permanent custody action.
